- A completed Conflict Minerals Reporting Template.
- Provide a certification that the products supplied to PRINTOR that contain tantalum, tin, tungsten or gold did not originate from the Democratic Republic of the Congo or adjoining countries.
- Provide the names and pertinent information of the smelters they use.

PRINTOR will take the appropriate actions to comply with applicable rules in addition to supporting our customers to reach our common goal to build up a socially and environmentally responsible supply chain.
